A Message from Pastor Roger

Thanksgiving

"Bless the Lord, O my soul, and all that is within me, bless his holy name. Bless the Lord, O my soul, and do not forget all his benefits..." —Psalm 103

Nancy and I expect to celebrate Thanksgiving a day later than the official national celebration date of November 27th, since our children and their families arrive the day after being with their in-laws. So, we'll be carving our turkey on Friday the 28th.

But whatever the actual Day, my season of Thanksgiving has already begun. With Nancy's illness, this past year has been loaded with challenges for us, and when we're in the midst of dealing with difficulties, we're likely not to "bless the Lord" and are apt to "forget all his benefits."

I'm grateful for our two children, their spouses and children, who are a growing source of pride and joy, and who give us immeasurable support. Our extended family members also surround us with their thoughts and prayers and numerous expressions of love.

Property & Finance Highlights October 14, 2014

- Memorial Gardens: two blue spruce trees have been purchased and planted to replace the dead/ dying Gebhardt trees.
- Peace Pole Garden: Kittleson will deliver the paver tiles this week. Little planting can be done this fall because low temperatures are coming.
- Lounge tiling: meeting is scheduled for October 22 to discuss options with a flooring company.
- Parking Lot: Wolf Paving representative on September 17 noted that the blacktop is holding up well
 and that they would give us an estimate for sealing next year if desired. Fill around the edges of the
 lot is mostly completed by needs to be seeded. Small cracks will be fixed if/when weather permits.
- Drain tile in the southwest garden is still under consideration.
- Kitchen faucets: both need to be replaced or repaired. New shut-off valves will make this job easier.
- Contribution Record-Keeping Software: Realm used for the first time on October 12. Online giving
 option is free to set up until December 31. No monthly fee makes it a good idea, even we are not
 sure we'll use it. Note: online giving is no charge until a transaction is made; transaction fee paid by
 church.
- Pledge drive: reviewed the first draft of a stewardship letter, with another meeting scheduled for Sunday, October 19.
- Copier: approved spending \$439 for new copier. Repair costs for old copier would have been \$354.
- Snow plowing: renewed contract with Boley.
- Financials: reviewed a rough draft of the 2015 budget. Reviewed the financial reports year-to-date for 2014.
- Next meeting: Tuesday, November 11, 2014, 7pm.
