Advent at Dale Heights

This Advent Season is certain to be a special one for Nancy and me, as we celebrate with you good people of Dale Heights. I look forward to our Sunday worship services, with the lighting of the Advent candles, and also to our special Christmas Eve service. What a joy it will be to share this season with all of our Dale Heights friends!

This season is a great opportunity to focus on the meaning of the Dale Heights Guiding Vision Statement, which you adopted in November of 2012. Throughout that statement we see words and concepts like reconciliation and peaceful resolution. 

Property & Finance Highlights November 11, 2014

- Memorial Gardens: bark has been spread.
- Peace Pole Garden: pavers have been laid and some shrubs and a tree have been planted. The peace pole will return to the concourse, and the garden hole will be covered for the winter.
- Flooring: looked at samples on October 22. Madison Carpets will look for additional vinyl flooring options.
- Malawi wall hanging: will be moved up to the concourse.
- Drainage: lounge lower exit door has been fitted with material to stop rainstorm runoff. Other drainage projects postponed until spring.
- Kitchen faucets: faucets are now repaired.
- Plowing: stakes have been placed to indicate snowplow boundaries.
- Leaking faucets in lounge and upstairs restrooms: reviewed comparison pricing for retail/commercial faucets and determined to go ahead soon with commercial-grade replacements installed by church volunteers.
- Attic noise: mousetraps and live trap, and exterminator advice will be sought.
- Financials: a few pledges have come in. Financial status as of 10/31/14 was reviewed. For Crop Walk next year, to ease bookkeeping, the committee requests that all checks be made out to Church World Service. An exception would be if the giver wishes to give checks or cash to Dale Heights one week before the walk, that would allow time to enter the contributions into the Dale Heights system and still comply with Crop Walk's donation deadline.
