A Message from Pastor Roger

November Is Pledge Month

In a long-ago pastorate, I was greeted by a young man who was obviously not of a disposition to compliment my annual stewardship sermon. Ours was the third church in succession he had visited in his exploring for a church to join, and his complaint was that in each of the sermons he had heard the topic was on the subject of giving. His "mistake" was in visiting during the time of the year when many churches were emphasizing financial support for their upcoming budget. But my reply to this young man should have been, after his hearing three sermons on giving, "Maybe God is trying to tell you something."

Sermons on financial stewardship are generally unpopular, sometimes due to their undo frequency, sometimes because of churches' poor management, or simply because they're based more on the need of churches rather than the teaching of Jesus, who said more about finances than anything except the kingdom of God. Our Lord knows the vital connection of the management of our possessions with our willingness to give to the cause of the kingdom and share with others out of our Godgiven abundance. God's will is to provide for his work, along with providing for our needs as we share out of the abundance he has entrusted to us.

This brings me to our annual stewardship emphasis, which will culminate on Pledge Sunday, Nov. 26. Because of our loss of income and our increased financial needs, our faithful giving to the Dale Heights budget is more important than ever. On this year's (appropriately!) Thanksgiving weekend Sunday we will have the privilege and responsibility to make our pledges during the offertory. A pledge is defined as "a solemn promise or undertaking," and the amount we pledge is an affirmation of our solemn promise that we'll give a certain amount to the cause of Christ through Dale Heights in 2024. Of course, because our pledge is to a God, who provides our needs, we may be able during the year to increase our giving beyond our pledge, and should our financial condition decline, both God and Dale Heights will understand the need to decrease our giving. But I ask you to join together with our church family in pledging what we believe God will enable us to give in 2024. I believe God IS telling us something! Let's be faithful!

Let's also welcome as our new Office Manager, Deb Hughes, who began her duties after the retirement of Donna Bucholz on Oct. 31. Thanks again to Donna for her good and faithful service, and a warm welcome to Deb.

Q: What's unique about American Christianity?

A: "History will be our guide to separating fact from fiction."

American society and culture have deeply shaped traditions of Christianity that have developed here since the 16th century. To make sense of American Christianity today, we'll unpack three, profound, historical and sociological influences: the trans-Atlantic origins of American Christianity; the legal disestablishment of religion and subsequent "marketplace" of religion; and ways Americans have boosted the development and growth of the global church in the 20th century. The history propelling these influences, as well as the tensions embedded within them, have made American Christianity distinct.

About Dan Hummel

Dan Hummel is the Director of University Engagement at Upper House, prior to which he held appointments at UW-Madison and Harvard University. The author of The Rise and Fall of Dispensationalism: How the Evangelical Battle over the End Times Shaped a Nation (Eerdmans, 2023) and Covenant Brothers: Evangelicals, Jews, and U.S.-Israeli Relations (University of Pennsylvania Press, 2019), Dan has written articles for the Washington Post, Christianity Today, and Religion News Service. He hosts Upper House's UpWords podcast, and co-hosts with John Terrill, PhD, With Faith in Mind - a new podcast that offers a thoughtful and faith-informed perspective on important issues and questions facing our society. His research has been published in Religion & American Culture and Church History. He earned his PhD in History from UW-Madison, as well as his MA in History and BA in History and Philosophy from Colorado State University.
