#### **Project Regeneration**

#### **September 15, 2024**

A well-attended potluck was held followed by a presentation on our **Project Regeneration**: history, methodology, analysis results and current status.

Major points were that we are not alone in financial stress and in small membership. While our attendance percentage of membership was high, our annual median giving rate was \$230 lower than what the Foundation leadership says is necessary for long term survival of our congregation. This is especially true when 2/3 of giving to our church comes from 5 families and 90% comes from those 70 and older.

As we move forward with trying to find what God is calling Dale Heights Church to be and what is its mission, Session has set a calendar of events to help the congregation in its decision.

#### October 13, 2024

There will be an informal congregational meeting after church to take questions and comments that you have, based on the information that was shared at the September 15th potluck.

If you wish your questions and comments to be anonymous, then please write your thoughts down and

they can be put in the envelope on the church office door, the collection plate or given to a Session member.

Also in October we are looking to host a non-church stakeholder such as our alderperson, Spring Harbor Neighborhood Association, neighbors and neighboring businesses for a short talk on how the church fits in the lives of our community.

Starting **December 29, 2024**, we will have a short "Minute for Mission" that will be a brief summary of a chapter from *The Sailboat Church* book we are using to help us in this project. Summary questions from the book will be included in the bulletin and the weekly e-news for you to use in helping you gather your thoughts.

#### March 9, 2025

With the start of Lent, we will ask all of you to participate in the 40 days of prayer as outlined in the *Sailboat* book so we can all make a decision on our future direction at a Called Congregational meeting on **Sunday April 27, 2025.** 

We have several copies of *The* Sailboat Church books still available in the church office for anyone who would like one.



## Spotlight on .... Rev. Kathleen Owens


Kathleen is ordained in the Presbyterian Church (USA).

We are fortunate to have had Kathleen as guest preacher at Dale Heights several times already. She will be preaching again this Sunday, October 6, for World Communion Sunday.

Celebration of World Wide Communion Sunday was adopted as a denominational practice in the Presbyterian Church (US) in 1936. Churches in other denominations were invited to celebrate with us from the beginning, but it wasn't until 1940 when the Department of Evangelism of the Federal Council of Churches (a predecessor body of the National Council of Churches) promoted extending the celebration to a number of churches around the world that the practice became widespread.

Today, World Communion Sunday is celebrated around the world, demonstrating that the church founded on Jesus Christ peacefully shares God-given goods in a world increasingly destabilized by globalization and global market economies based on greed.



# John Knox Presbytery is a community of communities, centered in Jesus Christ, linked to one another, and boldly responding to the Spirit's call to join God's mission.

It's time for the **Starfish campaign**! That beautiful starfish was chosen to represent our Presbytery's fundraising ministry to cancel medical debt. We won't be able to raise enough money to cancel all of the medical debt that's out there. **But we can make a difference in the lives of many families.** In only two years, the congregations of John Knox Presbytery have contributed just over \$47,000. That amount has been able to cancel \$5,832,268.74 in debt for 4,761 families. This is an amazing ministry!

Our ministry partner, Undue Medical Debt (formerly RIP Medical Debt), purchases large bundles of medical debt from hospitals and collection agencies for pennies on the dollar. This allows every dollar we send them to cancel at least \$100 of medical debt. So even a small amount will make a huge difference.

There are two important dates to remember for the 2024 Starfish Campaign. The culmination of our fundraising time is on **Sunday, October 20.** The other date to remember is November 15. That's the day that all contributions need to be at the Presbytery office.

A \$10 donation will cancel \$1,000 of medical debt for a family.

With the large increase in demand for food and housing in our community, we need to focus our financial and staff resources on making sure families can stay in their homes and have enough to eat. As you likely know, visits to our food pantry have tripled over the last two years, as has the amount of money we have to spend on food to keep up with the demand. The number of households that receive financial assistance each year from WayForward has increased by 90% since 2019. We still need your help—so please consider directing any support that would normally go to Winter Wishes toward our other programs.

We still have opportunities for you to engage your members in meaningful ways and also share joy this holiday season. This year the opportunities will be focused on food.

#### **HOLIDAY BAKING BASKETS**

Put together a basket or box of **shelf-stable and non-perishable essentials** for holiday baking.



All baskets should contain: flour, white sugar, brown sugar, powdered sugar, baking soda, baking powder, salt, vanilla, and vegetable oil. Consider personalizing your baking basket with a couple of add-ons such as: decorating sugars or sprinkles in a variety of colors, spices like cinnamon and nutmeg, cocoa powder, baking mixes, canned frosting, food coloring, packets of instant yeast, cookie cutters, oven mitts, spatula, a cookie sheet, or a rolling pin.
